
July 24, 2024 1700 UTC

KEY MESSAGES:

- A series of slow moving cold fronts will drift offshore and weaken across the western Atlantic over the next few days. Weak low pressures may develop and move NE along the slow moving boundaries.
- Along and just south of the fronts, pictured in the first image at right, sustained winds are expected in the 25 to 30 kt range, highest across the Gulf Stream.
- Seas will generally remain 9 ft or less, pictured in the second image at right, with highest seas across the outer mid-Atlantic waters.
- Scattered showers and thunderstorms are expected along and ahead of the fronts, and winds and seas will be locally higher in any strong thunderstorms.
- Conditions improve later in the weekend into early next week as a strong high pressure builds offshore. Winds are expected to diminish to 20 kt or less, with seas subsiding to 6 ft or less.

Outlook: East Coast N of 31N to 65W



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
